



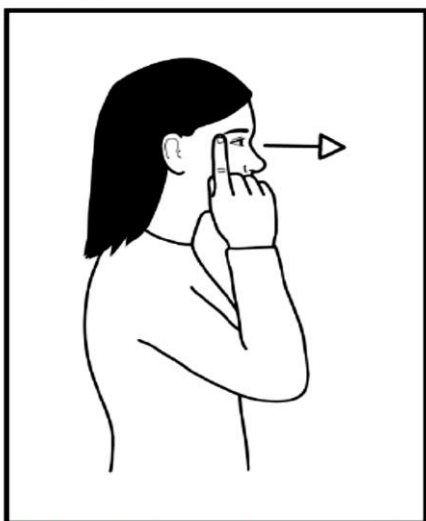

Top Tip for Supporting your Child's Interactions in Play

Follow your Child's Lead

When your child is playing, try to follow their lead and join in with their interests because your child is likely to pay more attention to things that they choose and want to play with. This will make it easier for your child to interact with you and learn new things in their play.



Literacy: Phonics



What you need:

- Empty bottle (or any see through container)
- Dry rice (or other like grain)
- Variety of small objects.

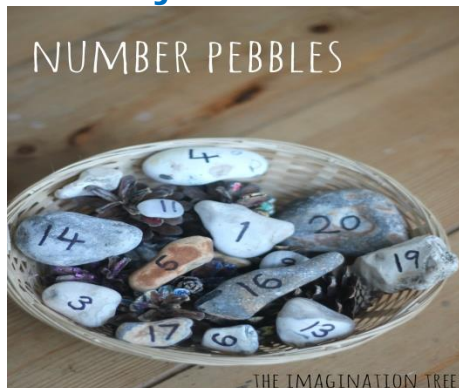
Once filled let children shake the bottle/container.

- Shake again what else can you find?

What you need:

- At least 20 small stones
- Marker or Sharpie pen.

Activities

Write a number on each stone.

Mix them up, put back in order.

Remove one; can you/ your child spot which number is missing?

Can you tell the number before, the number after?

Which 2 pebbles make 17? (1&7)



...or make up your own sums!

Numeracy

Counting Songs

Counting rhymes are a fun way to teach your children to count forwards and backwards and can help build their developing number concept. Some of these teach rote counting forwards or backwards (e.g. reciting from one to 10) and some teach number concept (e.g. there were 5, one fell off, now there are 4).

Repeat until there are none left:

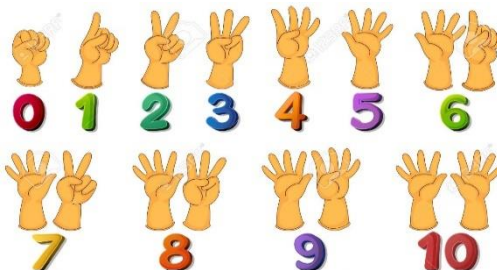
One little speckled frog
