<p>Life Skills – Practice a skill that you find tricky to do. <p>Stay Connected – Create your own talent show in your home. Practice a talent like joke telling, dance, song, drama, magic tricks etc. and share this with your family. Encourage others in your home to have a go too.</p>	<p>Stay Connected – Enjoy spotting birds outside. You might want to create a bird feeder or put out some food to attract them to your garden. Write down things you'd like to do / go / see when lockdown is over and pop it the jar. Think of the fun you'll have once you get to reopen the jar.</p> 
<p>Be Creative – Have a go at the toilet roll challenge. What can you create out of a simple toilet roll tube.
